



**EASING OF RESTRICTIONS FOLLOWING COVID-19
BRUNEI DARUSSALAM**

PLACES OF WORSHIP OTHER THAN MOSQUES AND SURAU

OPERATIONAL READINESS LEVEL 4

(From 3 August 2020)

Specific Requirements:

1. Places of worship other than mosques and surau are allowed to operate as normal.

General requirements:

1. The management of places of worship other than mosques and surau are required to obtain BruHealth QR code specific for their premise and print out the QR code and place it at the entrance so that it can be scanned by visitors before entering and upon leaving the premise.
2. The management of places of worship other than mosques and surau are required to ensure cleanliness and physical distancing measures are practiced in accordance to the following instructions:
 - 2.1 Conduct temperature checks for all visitors at all entrances to the premise.

- 2.2 Provide hand washing facility or hand sanitizers for visitors' use.
- 2.3 Ensure visitors and staff wear face masks. Cloth face masks may be worn provided that it is washed daily after use.
- 2.4 Clean and disinfect before and after each public service.
3. Visitors and staff who are having symptoms of the infection are advised from attending until they have fully recovered.
4. Failure to comply with the instructions given is an offence under the Infectious Diseases Act (Chapter 204) and if found guilty, may be fined to up to \$10,000 or imprisonment for up to 6 months or both.

PLACES OF WORSHIP OTHER THAN MOSQUES AND SURAU

OPERATIONAL READINESS LEVEL 3

(6 July 2020 to 2 August 2020)

Specific Requirements:

1. Places of worship other than mosques and surau are allowed to operate at 80% of normal capacity at any one time.

General requirements:

1. The management of places of worship other than mosques and surau are required to obtain BruHealth QR code specific for their premise and print out the QR code and place it at the entrance so that it can be scanned by visitors before entering and upon leaving the premise.
2. The management of places of worship other than mosques and surau are required to ensure cleanliness and physical distancing measures are practiced in accordance to the following instructions:
 - 2.1 Conduct temperature checks for all visitors at all entrances to the premise.

- 2.2 Provide hand washing facility or hand sanitizers for visitors' use.
 - 2.3 Ensure visitors practice physical distancing (at least 1 meter apart).
 - 2.4 Ensure visitors and staff wear face masks. Cloth face masks may be worn provided that it is washed daily after use.
 - 2.5 Clean and disinfect before and after each public service.
3. Visitors and staff who are having symptoms of the infection or those who are at a high risk of developing severe form of the infection are advised from attending until they have fully recovered.
 4. Failure to comply with the instructions given is an offence under the Infectious Diseases Act (Chapter 204) and if found guilty, may be fined to up to \$10,000 or imprisonment for up to 6 months or both.

PLACES OF WORSHIP OTHER THAN MOSQUES AND SURAU

OPERATIONAL READINESS LEVEL 2

(18 June 2020 to 5 July 2020)

Specific Requirements:

1. Churches are allowed to operate for public service for 2 hours daily.
2. Temples are allowed to operate for public service for 2 hours daily.
3. Other places of worship other than mosques and surau are allowed to operate at 60% of normal capacity at any one time.

General requirements:

1. The management of places of worship other than mosques and surau are required to obtain BruHealth QR code specific for their premise and print out the QR code and place it at the entrance so that it can be scanned by visitors before entering and upon leaving the premise.
2. The management of places of worship other than mosques and surau are required to ensure cleanliness and physical distancing measures are practiced in accordance to the following instructions:

- 2.1 Conduct temperature checks for all visitors at all entrances to the premise.
 - 2.2 Provide hand washing facility or hand sanitizers for visitors' use.
 - 2.3 Ensure visitors practice physical distancing (at least 1.5 meters apart).
 - 2.4 Ensure visitors and staff wear face masks. Cloth face masks may be worn provided that it is washed daily after use.
 - 2.5 Clean and disinfect before and after each public service.
3. Visitors and staff who are having symptoms of the infection or those who are at a high risk of developing severe form of the infection are advised from attending until they have fully recovered.
 4. Failure to comply with the instructions given is an offence under the Infectious Diseases Act (Chapter 204) and if found guilty, may be fined to up to \$10,000 or imprisonment for up to 6 months or both.

PLACES OF WORSHIP OTHER THAN MOSQUES AND SURAU

OPERATIONAL READINESS LEVEL 1

(5 June 2020 to 17 June 2020)

Specific Requirements:

1. Churches are allowed to operate for public service for 2 hours on Sunday only.
2. Temples are allowed to operate for public service for 2 hours on one day per week.
3. Other places of worship other than mosques and surau are allowed to operate at 30% of normal capacity at any one time.

General requirements:

1. The management of places of worship other than mosques and surau are required to obtain BruHealth QR code specific for their premise and print out the QR code and place it at the entrance so that it can be scanned by visitors before entering and upon leaving the premise.

2. The management of places of worship other than mosques and surau are required to ensure cleanliness and physical distancing measures are practiced in accordance to the following instructions:

2.1 Conduct temperature checks for all visitors at all entrances to the premise.

2.2 Provide hand washing facility or hand sanitizers for visitors' use.

2.3 Ensure visitors practice physical distancing (at least 1.5 meters apart).

2.4 Ensure visitors and staff wear face masks. Cloth face masks may be worn provided that it is washed daily after use.

2.5 Clean and disinfect before and after each public service.

3. Visitors and staff who are having symptoms of the infection or those who are at a high risk of developing severe form of the infection are advised from attending until they have fully recovered.

4. Failure to comply with the instructions given is an offence under the Infectious Diseases Act (Chapter 204) and if found guilty, may be fined to up to \$10,000 or imprisonment for up to 6 months or both.
